(Lights go up on Liam McFee (dressed in a Royal Canadian Navy Captain Uniform) (Downstage Centre) (1968 Uniform)

Liam: (to audience says "Whirlwind" by Alix Babiak)

(Blackout)

<u>ACT 1</u>

Scene 1

(Lights go up on screen upstage centre. It says "World War 1 1914-1918")

(Dim lights – Spotlight goes up on Narrator who is downstage right)

Narrator: Liam McFee still wore the uniform with its torn lapels and burnt sleeves. In the moonlight that was streaming across the ocean, Liam's eyes were very bright. Liam's lips were slightly parted. Liam could not breathe through the nose. It was broken. Liam's face was burnt and all scratched up. Liam's hands were bleeding. Liam's ship lost for over a month. Will Liam ever get home?

Liam McFee never complains or talks of this. Liam just keeps on working for his country Canada and all the peace in the world.

(Spotlight goes off. Narrator exits stage right.)

(Lights go up. Back from the war Liam McFee is in a navy soldiers uniform and Cassandra McFee, a nurse and his partner both are 19 years old. They are sitting on a swing downstage centre)

Liam: (hands holding head then lifts head looking at Cassandra in grief) 16 million Dead.

Cassandra: I am surprised you made it home.

Liam: "The War to End all Wars". Darn, I am going to make this place a home again.

(lights go down then spotlight on Narrator to say "Over There Canada")

Shawn get your gun, get your gun
The bombs are flying, yes they're flying
They're coming, yes they are coming
Shawn get your gun, get your gun.

Chorus

Over There, Over There
Look Over There
That Canada is coming, That Canada is coming
The Brave Canadian Navy and Army
Say the Word, Over There.

Shawn get your gun, get your gun
The bombs are flying. Yes, They're Flying
The're Flying
They're Coming, yes they're coming
Shawn get your gun
Get your gun.

(Blackout)

Scene 2

(Lights go up. Liam and Cassandra are sitting on swing downstage centre)

Liam: Don't know if I should go back to fishing. Bumped into George from Salmon Run Fisheries and George offered me a job. I thought I could do more training to become a Captain of my own ship with the Canadian Navy. Just going up the ranks. Saw a lot, travelling overseas. Too much I think. I saw guns fired at merchant ships. Yah, Merchant Ships and those ships went down. Tried to save as many people as we could. Luckily my ship did not go down.

Seen by a bulletin, this Versaille Treaty seems fishy with Germany. Who knows if Germany is going to pay back all the damage they have done. We definitely need a strong Navy. The Royal Canadian Navy only started with three ships and 350 men. We mostly were used to protect Allie Merchant Ships that brought supplies to Great Britain, France and to the front lines. Never saw many major battles. One huge battle we were in, was when a British Warship was attacked by three German boats. We hardly escaped. I ended up in the water and saved by another British boat.

Now I am back home. What am I going to do to forget about all this for awhile? Cassandra: You can stay right here with me. I'll work and support you. I'll even have your children . . . but I think you would get bored.

You go down to that mess hall and discuss this with few of your comrads. I have to check on some brocken soldiers at the hospital. I'll have supper ready for you when you come back.

(lights go down, pause, lights go up)

Liam: (to audience) I am going to become a Royal Canadian Navy Captain. (Liam has a big smile on his face.)

(Blackout)

Scene 3

(spotlight goes up on Narrator downstage right)

Narrator: Liam McFee became a Navy Captain and had a ship. Cassandra McFee remained a Nurse at the Victoria General Hospital. They had two children, Liza and Callum. By 2019, they had many grandchildren and great grandchildren. (This legacy stuff you know) One great great grandchild, Margeaux McFee, is now 18 years old. Margeaux is a Canadian Captain with Navy Cadets (you know, all those youngsters). Margeaux teaches other Navy Cadets how to sail, how to survive and teaches and lives by The Canadian Navy Cadet mission to protect this Country. Margeaux has her own opinions of the

history of the major world wars and the current affairs of the day.

(Spotlight goes down)

(lights go up) (Margeaux McFee is in Navy Cadet Uniform. Margeaux reads "It's All About Hate" to her students (the audience).

Margeaux: World War 1 (clears her throat) "It is All About Hate"
The World as we know it came to an end in 1914. "The War to End All Wars".
(Wishful thinking)

There was an assasination of Austrian, Archduke Ferdinand and Partner by a Serb Nationalist.

AND THE WORLD ALMOST CAME TO AN END!

Chorus

Victor, Victor Walheim of Germany
Francis Joseph the First of Austria-Hungary
Ismail Enver Pasha of the Trurkish Ottoman Empire
Tzar Nicholas the Second of Russia
And Lenin of Russia pulled out.

ALL FULL OF HATE

Wilhelm the Second of Germany (a facist) made Germany the greatest economic and military power of the World. The Turkish Ottoman Empire were called "the sick people of Europe". However, they had great power. You put Germany and Turkey Together,

YES, IT WILL BE THE END OF THE WORLD!

Chorus

The enemy is Germany, Austria Hungary (really angry at the Serbs), Italy (a Cwandry) and others. The other side was Britain, then Canada and France to name a few.

ACT 2 – WORLD WAR II

Scene 1

(Lights on Screen Upstage Centre – On Screen "1939-1945 – World War II")

(Lights Down, Then Spotlight goes up on Liam (Now a Captain in the Canadian Navy who is Wearing a Uniform)

(Liam says "Whirlwind" from Overture by Alix Babiak) (At end of "Whirlwind" Liam standing centre stage says in grief)

Leam: Yes Callum's ship went down. MY GROWN CHILD'S ship went down.

(Blackout)

Scene 2

(lights go up) (Liam is sitting on a chair downstage centre and Cassandra is sitting on swing – both are holding their head in grief)

Liam: (holding back the tears) This war was the worst there ever was. Just ostrosities. A friend of mine walked into Oshwitz. Too horrible to describe. Walking into China was worse. It's good they didn't hit Canada. I bet we were going to be next on the chopping block. Then they invent the frigging Atomic Bomb. What are they going to think of next! Hiroshima will be suffering for a long long time.

Cassandra: Not Right! Just Not Right! Then we lost Callum. Our grown child. He looked so handsome in the Navy Uniform. Callum died bravely and did a lot for this country. Like you Liam . . . strong, brave and too sensitive. Followed in your footsteps, Captain Liam McFee. What are we left with? (with a mischievious smile on her face) Liza and the beautiful family and memories and pictures of Callum. You know we are better off than other people.

Liam: Anyone can be in the depths of despair and you always, Cassandra, bring a smile to everyone's face. What would I do without you.

Scene 3

(lights go up on Margeaux McFee downstage centre)

Margeaux: (Clears Throat) (To Audience) World War II – 1939-1945 In 1939, there was the devil, Hitler, who rose to power in Germany and was called the Third Reich. Hitler wasn't the only the devil. There was Mussolini, Stalin and the Emporer of Japan. All of them were trying to conquer and rule the world. Hitler took most of Europe, except Switzerland. Hitler tried Great Britain and almost succeeded. Stalin, along with Hitler, had most of the Netherlands. There was a fishy situation with Stalin of the U.S.S.R.

THE WORLD ALMOST ENDED AGAIN!

In 1968, there was a big organizational change in the Canadian Armed Forces. They united to become one. Navy, Army and Air Force. Let's just say everyone lost their individuality. Liam's uniform turned to green. A Big disappointment. Liam retired that year and died inside at that time. Liam died a sorrowful man in 1970. Cassandra passed away a year later. They left a legacy of McFees across Canada. Margeaux McFee tells a history of it all in 2019 as a Navy Cadet Captain to her students.

(Blackout)

Scene 2

(Lights go up on Margeaux downstage centre and reads "It's All About Hate")

Margeaux: The Cold War is a state of military and political tension after World War II. This was between the Western Block (the United States of America, it's Nato Allies) and powers in the Eastern Block (The Soviet Union, it's allies in the Warsaw Pact and later what is now called the People's Republic of China). In

2019, some Historians believe that the Cold War never ended. Communism vs. Democracy and Monarchy.

The Cold War began with the Truman Doctrine, the Marshall Plan and the Berlin Blockade. These were events between 1945 – 1948. The U.S. versus the U.S.S.R. Heard of the Berlin Wall?

Chorus

Stalin, Stalin, Stalin – Joseph Stalin
Cheing Kai-Shek – Guess from Where?
Yah, We had Victor, Victor Valeim

ACT 1

Scene 1

(Lights go up on Narrator standing downstage right)

Narrator: Margeaux McFee's Grandchild, Fern was also a Captain for the Navy Cadets and went to the University of Victoria to get a Social Work Degree. Fern saw everything, You know, the down and out children, families, drug addicts, criminals and don't forget the mentally ill. Fern saw worse things that Liam McFee saw in war. It wasn't until Fern McBride met Laurie McFadden that Fern could find peace when Fern came home.

Laurie was a soldier in the peacekeeping forces of the Royal Canadian Armed Forces. The nose was broken first by the comrads, then by an Egyptian, then a person from Cyprus, then a person from the Congo and all Laurie wanted to do was come home. You think Liam McFee saw it all. Laurie McFadden was not on the sea but on land. There was nowhere left to run.

Both wanted to protect their country. Like a giving Canadian, all Laurie McFadden wanted was peace.

(Lights go down)

Scene 2

(Lights go up)

(Laurie in a Royal Canadian Peacekeeping Uniform stands downstage centre)

Laurie: (to audience)
There is a port called Victoria
On a Western Bay
A lonely soldier went on leave
And found a sight he couldn't believe
There was a person in this harbor town

That really caught the eye

Fern you're a fine person
What a good life we could have together
That is, if I didn't have to leave this town
With a chance, it would be forever.

(Lights dim)

(Fern McBride is in a Royal Canadian Navy Cadet Captain Uniform and is speaking to a class, Fern is downstage centre and lights go up)

Fern: (to audience) (clears throat)

In 1939, there was a devil Hitler, who rose to power in Germany & was called the Third Reich. Hitler wasn't the only devil.

Laurie: (from audience) You've got that Right!

Fern: (stunned) There was Mussolini, Stalin and the Emperor of Japan. All of them were trying to conquer and rule the world. Hitler took most of Europe, except Switzerland. Hitler tried Great Britain and almost succeeded. Stalin, along with Hitler, had most of the Netherlands. There was a fishy situation with Stalin of the U.S.S.R.

EVERYONE JUST TOOK COVER!

Laurie: (from audience) Your Darn Right!

(Fern leaves stage left all frazzled)

(Narrator walks from stage right to downstage centre)

Narrator: And that is how Fern McBride met Laurie McFadden. Laurie wore his uniform and looked so handsome. In the dim of the lights, Laurie passed Fern a note. There eyes met and Laurie McFadden knew that they would be together forever.

Yes, like Liam McFee, Laurie saw it all. Laurie lives his life alone again now, a forgotten hero. All Laurie wanted was peace and to protect his country. Covid 19 has done Laurie in and the rest of the world.

It was still trying times after the Second World War. I am sorry to say in 2021, it will be a never ending war. There is no turning back.

Thus our story will continue in 1947.

Scene 3

(Light go up and Fern is standing centre stage in her Royal Canadian Navy Cadet Uniform. Fern speaks to the audience as the class)

Fern: The first United Nations Peacekeeping Mission was UNTCOK or the temporary mission in Korea in 1947. (To this day all isn't working) There were several civilian and military personnel of the Royal Canadian Armed Forces. The first military observers were in 1948.

A Canadian Peacekeeper would try to keep treaties, save the people by providing food, shelter and clothing. They would come between two enemies and try to stop fights and violence from breaking out. Chaos could break loose at any minute. The Challenge was keeping the peace because they were all full of hate.

Canada protected through the years such countries and territories as Egypt, Israel, India, Pakistan, the Congo, New West Guinea, Indonesia, Cyprus, Nambia to name a few.

(Fern says under her breath) Oh Yah, Lester B. Pearson . . .

The Right Honourable Prime Minister of Canada, Lester B. Pearson was a Nobel Peace prize winner and a Canadian Hero. Pearson brought Canada to a world power. Pearson was the founder of Modern United Nations Peacekeeping. Also for Canada, he brought in for us Canadians, medicare, old age security, Canada Pension, Unemployment Insurance and Family Services as we know it today.

NO. . . US CANADIANS ARE NOT USUALLY FULL OF HATE (Fern exits stage left and Narrator enters to downstage right)

Narrator: (to audience) Laurie, went on leave from peace keeping missions and would attend Fern's lectures all the time. He would pass a note and they would meet later. One day, one of the notes said "Will You Be My Partner for Life!". Thus Fern became Fern McBride McFadden.

Laurie was in the Sinai Desert, in Cyprus and lastly Rhuwanda. Oh Yes, the nose was broken first by his comrads, then by an Egyptian and then lastly a Tsusi. All Laurie McFadden wanted to do was to go home. What a Thankless Job.

(Lights go down)

Scene 4

(Lights go up, Narrator is downstage Right)

Narrator: Laurie McFadden, when retired, lives in Victoria, British Columbia with his wife Fern McBride McFadden. Laurie was with the army for over 50 years. Fern worked as a Social Worker for the army for many many years. They had no children.

Fern, one day, in older years suffered from dementia and had a bad heart. Laurie remained healthier than a horse. When Laurie could not take care of Fern anymore, Laurie put Fern in a Nursing Home. This broke Laurie's heart. Laurie would go visit Fern for most of the day, then walk through China Beach, sit by the ocean for hours and then go home to an empty house.

Then came the Covid 19, where Laurie could no longer visit Fern at all. All Laurie could do was to go to China Beach, walk through the paths and sit by the ocean. Every day Laurie would go home to an empty house. For hours in the dark Laurie would look at a picture of Fern. He would hear Fern Saying "I will wait for you until you come home. When you get back, you can help me with my lectures to the Cadets and interrupt me whenever you want."

This always put a smile on Laurie's face. He would shut the light and dream about that day in Heaven, when they could do that again.

ACT 1

Scene 1

(Lights go up, Narrator Standing Downstage Centre)

Narrator:

Leni was born in 1983 in Chilliwak, British Columbia, Canada. Leni was a distant cousin of Liam McFee. Leni McFee joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1999. He was one of those brave Canadian Jet Airfighters who protected the U.S.A. after the World Trade Tower Bombing. This invoked Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty, which deemed the attacks to an external attack on all NATO members (which were many) under the idea of collective defense. Also, all flights going in and out of the U.S.A (this is after the attack on the World Trade Towers) were redirected to Canadian Soil where the planes had safe haven. This is Canada as a Protector. Leni was a Canadian Hero. They also like Leni in the U.S.A.

During the time of the second Iraq war (Leni wasn't there for the first) between Nato and Iraq, Leni's plane was shot down. Leni was transported to an Army Hospital in Chilliwak, British Columbia. (Lights Dim and go up on Narrator Standing Downstage Centre)

Leni could not breathe through the nose. It was broken. Leni's face was burnt and scratched up. Leni's hands were bleeding and Leni was sent home.

(Lights Dim and come up again on Narrator Standing Downstage Centre)

Leni spent many months being rehabilitated in Savoy Hospital in Ottawa, Ontario. Savoy Hospital in one of the many hospitals that are used for our War Heroes. Leni's legs were shattered, therefore, he was disabled for life.

After being discharged from Hospital Leni applied for more Training. Leni decided to stay with the Royal Canadian Armed Forces. He studied aviation and weapon control. He was one of those guys, like in the Sinai Desert, that was just sitting there and calling out commands to the rest of the NATO forces. While at school, Leni enjoyed ice fishing, general fishing, fly fishing. Yes, all kinds of fishing. Leni was a hoser aye and really liked beer. The typical Canadian. Leni also sat on a sled, pulled with Huskys during a dog race. You could also see Leni with all the comrads sitting drunk on the back of a sleigh pulled by Clydesdales. They would all sing a song like this:

They had lifted some restrictions. Yes, we have to use our imagination during the Covid 19 where people spend a lot of time alone. Just use your imagination. It is still the Covid 19 and let's say, Leni and that beautiful person lived happily ever after.

NARRATOR:

AS YOU REMEMBER, LENI MCFEE HAS A DESK JOB WITH THE ROYAL CANADIAN ARMED FORCES. LENI SPENDS A LOT OF TIME DRINKING WITH HIS FRIENDS, FISHING AND RIDING ON BACKS OF SLEIGHS. THAT WAS THEN, THIS IS NOW. THERE IS A BEAUTIFUL PERSON WITH AUBURN HAIR THAT LENI COOKED MANY MEALS FOR.

LOU MCFEE, A SOCIAL WORKER WITH THE CANADIAN ARMED FORCES SPENT (AND STILL DOES) MANY HOURS AT THE ARMY BARRACKS, CONSULTING SARGEANTS AND GENERALS ABOUT THEIR INFANTRY MEN, PILOTS AND SUCH. HE HAD MANY BEAUTIFUL PEOPLE AND DRANK A LOT OF BEER, ESPECIALLY WITH LENI.

HOWEVER, WITH THE COVID 19, THEIR LIPS WERE SLIGHTLY PARTED, THEIR UNIFORMS AND CLOTHES WERE TORN, THEIR NOSES WERE BLEEDING AND THEY WERE FORCED TO WORK FROM HOME AND STAY HOME (LIKE EVERYONE IN CANADA. REALLY, AROUND THE WORLD) THEN TO TOP IT OFF, FORCED TO TAKE TWO VACCINES (AND THAT ISN'T FINISHED YET). LENI REFULED TO THE VACCINES. HE WAS ONE OF THE MANY DUE TO MEDICAL CONDITIONS COULD NOT TAKE THE VACCINE. YES, LENI LOST HIS JOB.

LENI HAS SEEN THE WORST KIND OF BATTLES, DISABLED IN THE AIR FORCE (SHOT DOWN), WORKED SO HARD TO GET BACK ON HIS FEET (WHICH HE NEVER DID . . . IN A WHEELCHAIR FOR LIFE), WORKED OVERSEAS SHOUTING COMMANDS FOR PEACE IN A SHACK IN THE MIDDLE OF THE SINAI DESERT. HE THEN TOOK HIS KNOWLEDGE TO OTTAWA, ONTARIO, ONLY TO BE SHUNNED FROM ALL OF HIS COUNTRY (CANADA). WHAT WAS LOU TO DO WITH HIS COUSIN, FRIEND FOR LIFE, THE ONE OF A KIND LENI MCFEE? IS THIS THE WAY WE TREAT OUR HEROES? I GUESS IT IS . . . LOOK AT JESUS CHRIST.

LOU WOULD AND STILL DOES BRING LENI GROCERIES, BEER AND CHEER. WHAT ABOUT THIS BEAUTIFUL PERSON. THE PERSON MOVED TO THE OTTAWA, VALLEY.

ONE DAY, LOU WAS BRINGING (THE BEST WAS CHEER) ALL KINDS OF THINGS FOR LENI. HE FOUND LENI COLLAPSED IN HIS APARTMENT, WITH THE TV BLARING, HIS COMPUTER GEARED TOWARD ANOTHER VIRTUAL REALITY GAME AND LOUD MUSIC IN THE BACKGROUND. YES, WORLD WAR 1V AND ITS WEAPONS.

LOU GAVE LENI MOUTH TO MOUTH RESUSITATION. LENI'S HEAD WAS BLEEDING. YES, LENI'S LIPS WERE SLIGHTLY PARTED, LENI'S CLOTHES WERE TORN AND IT SMELT LIKE DEAD BODIES IN THE APARTMENT. LENI, FINALLY OPENED THE EYES AND LOU CARRIED LENI'S BROKEN BODY TO BED. LOU TOOK TWO WEEKS OFF AND LENI WAS UNDER LOU'S CARE FOR LIFE.

LOU, FIRST HAD TO TURN OFF THE TV, THE COMPUTER AND THE LOUD MUSIC. THEN LOU HAD TO CLEAN AND DISINFECT LENI'S APARTMENT. LOU ALSO USED ALL HIS KNOWLEDGE AND EXPERIENCE OF HIS SOCIAL WORK WAYS. TONS OF WALKS LENI AND LOU TOOK AND THEY CUT BACK THE BEER. MARIJUANA WAS IN AND YAH THEY TOOK A TOKE OR TWO.

WHAT PEOPLE DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT LENI (NO BRAINER, HE LEARNT IT IN THE AIR FORCE) (YOU CAN'T FLY A PLANE WITHOUT SOME SORT OF COMPUTER KNOWLEDGE) LENI WAS A COMPUTER GENIUS. LENI COULD MAKE COMPUTERS, FIX COMPUTERS AND OUTWIT ANY HACKER AND PROBLEM. HE SHOULD HAVE WORKED FOR CESUS. BUT, LENI WAS NOT VACCINATED. SO LENI (BEING THE FIGHTER) OPENED UP A COMPUTER BUSINESS RIGHT IN LENI'S OWN HOME. WHAT ABOUT THE BEAUTIFUL PERSON. THE PERSON WOULD COME VISIT LENI SOMETIMES FOR REALLY GOOD MEAL. WE DON'T KNOW WHAT GOES ON BEHIND CLOSED DOORS JUST USE YOUR IMAGINATION. DID THEY LIVE HAPPILY EVER AFTER. LOU THINKS THEY WILL.

The Young Person

Was first sent to Salmon Arm, British Columbia
There were torrential rains, floods and destruction Everywhere
He spent his time Sandbagging and ditches for all the livestock that
Had died.

They were pulled out, only to be stationed back to the long-term care facilities and reservations to transport vaccines for the Covid 19. So Luke changed diapers, did a nurses job and tried to save some Canadian Lives.

It didn't matter to Luke whether you were black, white, red or green As long as you were a Canadian, he would protect and defend you. Luke, when he was working was a beautiful sight to see.

Scene 1

(lights go up on the Narrator Downstage Rt. – Spotlight)

Narrator: Luke McFee was Liam McFee's great great great great great grandson. Luke was born in Chilliwak, British Columbia and as a young child, Luke really liked his B B Gun. Luke was tall, like Liam, Luke's great great great great great grandfather and had eyes of blue. Luke's lips were slightly parted, Luke's nose was always bleeding from all

those fights over the beautiful people. Therefore, Luke's nose was broken. Luke is a rugged looking person.

Brandy Tysek was born and bred in Latvia. Brandy was brought up on a farm and moved to the city when Brandy was 21. Brandy worked for the Canadian Armed Forces Base in Latvia under a sargeant's command. Office Work, you know. Brandy Tysek and Luke McFee met when Brandy was walking to work. Brandy's hair was black and long and Brandy's eyes were deep dark brown. Luke just took one look at Brandy and became infatuated immediately. Let's see what Happens . . .

(Note: This is done very quickly. Lights dim and Narrator exit Stage Rt and lights go up on Brandy enters stage left carrying a pile of books. Brandy trips and the books fall to the Ground. Luke enters Stage Rt. In army uniform. Helps her with her books and their eyes meet and Luke grabs Brandy's hand. (Black Out) (Then Spotlight on Narrator Downstage Rt)

Narrator: Should I say more . . . Luke joined the Army as an infantry Man at the age of 18. Most currently Luke was stationed in Montreal at a long-term care facility, bringing vaccines for the Covid 19 and acting as a nurse maid to the Canadian Senior Citizens there. Luke was then stationed in British Columbia during landslides and torrential rain. Luke was sandbagging and digging ditches to cover all the livestock's dead remains.

After that, then to Latvia to a Canadian Armed Forces Base. The Operation was called Operation Reassurance. This was the Canadian Armed Forces way to give defensive and deterring measures in Central and Eastern Europe.

Now, Luke is stationed on the Eastern Border of the Ukraine. He is trying to keep the Russian Forces out of the Ukraine. Is this World War V? Some Historians say the Cold War was the third World War. Narrator: So the World Came to an End. Let us say Canada survived. Luke saved Brandy from Latvia and ended up at a Canadian Army Base Called Shilo in Portage La Prairie, Manitoba. There they found food, shelter and clothing. Oh Yes, their lips were slightly parted, their noses were broken and their clothes were tattered and torn. A New Canada was born. The Old Canada was filled with Pandemics, War, Racism and Hate. This New Canada is filled with wheat fields, sunshine and all Canadians working hand in hand for peace.
